**NOTICE in regard to COVID-19, CONJUNCTIVITIS infections and spread of
DENGUE**

COVID-19 infections are alarmingly increasing again in Bangladesh. Over the last couple of days the COVID-19 positivity rate jumps to 10 percent in Bangladesh (Source: The Daily Star of 14th September 2022).

While you are on campus; you must always wear a well-fitting face mask, maintain social distancing and use hand sanitizer even when hands are not visibly dirty, cough or sneeze into a bent elbow or tissue.

Dengue, mosquito-borne flavivirus infection, has taken its deadly appearance during the first half of September 2022. Dengue virus is transmitted between humans and mosquitoes: *Ae. aegypti* and *Ae. albopictus* are the principal vectors of the disease, and both mosquito species are widely distributed in Bangladesh. We request you to **use insect repellent, wear long-sleeved shirts and long pants, and control mosquitoes inside and outside your office and home.**

Conjunctivitis, pink eye, is also on the rise in Chattogram, there are detected cases of pink eye at CIU Campus. Viral and bacterial conjunctivitis (pink eye) are very contagious. They can spread easily from person to person.

If you are tested positive for any of the previously mentioned diseases, please do not come to CIU Campus and take necessary treatment.
